Methodology

- The results included in this presentation are based on a telephone study conducted from May 8 to May 11, 2015, among:

301 adult residents of the Courtenay-Alberni riding

302 adult residents of the Cowichan-Malahat-Langford riding

301 adult residents of the Esquimalt-Saanich-Sooke riding

301 adult residents of the Burnaby-North Seymour riding

 The data has been statistically weighted according to Canadian census figures for age, gender and region. The margin of error—which measures sample variability—is +/- 5.6 percentage points for each riding, 19 times out of 20.



The NDP is ahead in all four federal ridings. The Greens are second in Burnaby—North Seymour and the Conservatives are second in the remaining three.

If the federal election were held tomorrow, which one of these candidates would you support in your federal constituency?




Preferred Prime Minister


All things considered, do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements? – "British Columbia would benefit from more oil tankers on the coast."

Climate Change





Government Surveillance




